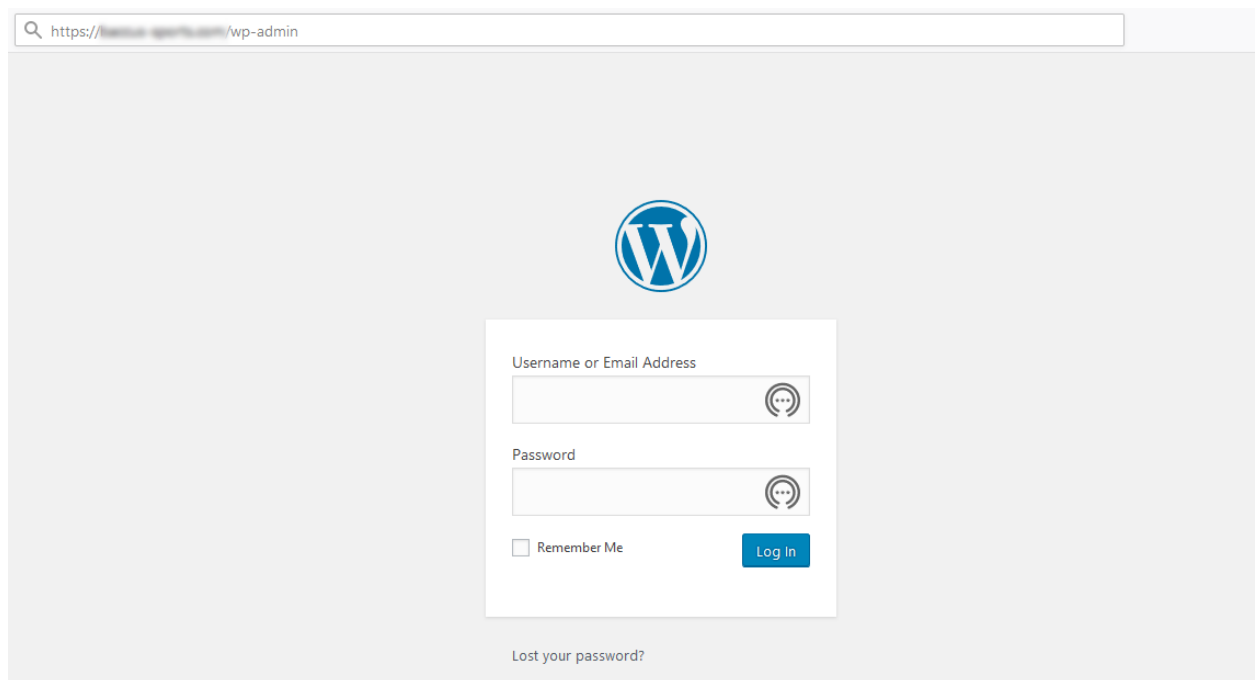
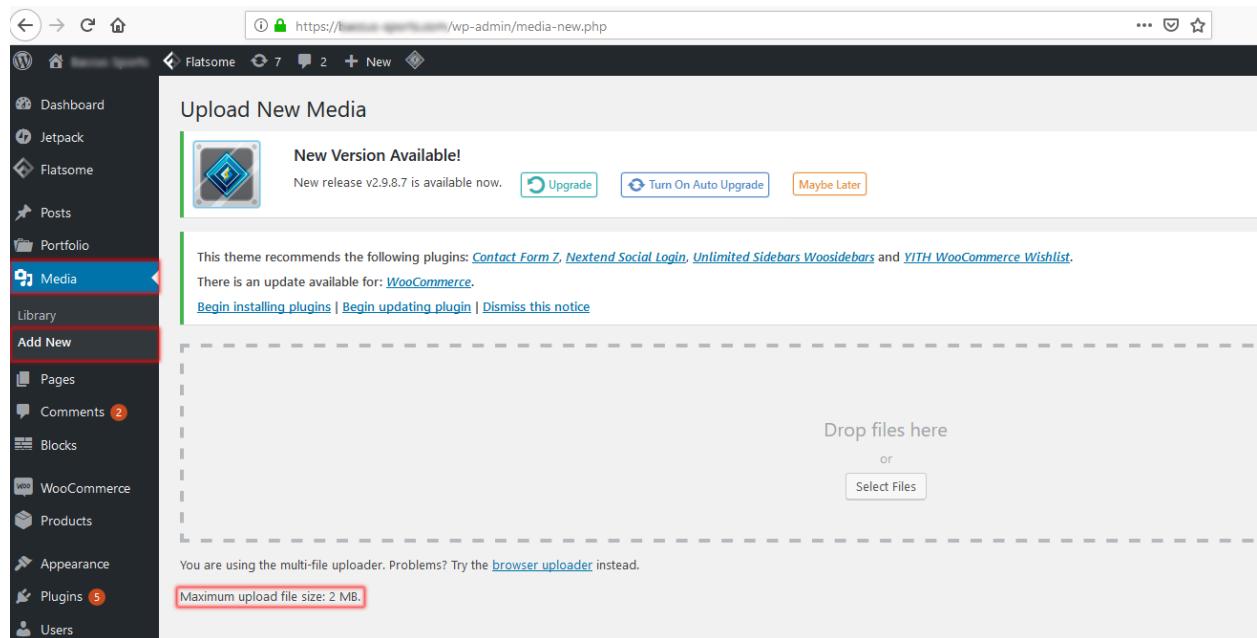


How To Increase the WordPress Maximum Upload File Size

If you have WordPress running in your web hosting environment, no doubt that you might run into issue like uploading larger files to your WordPress web site. There is nothing to worry about this as this is a common issue faced by all WordPress users out there. There are many options to fix this issue, in this step-by-step guide we will focus on the easiest way to fix this issue.



1. Login using your username and password to access your WordPress website administration page



2. Select “Media” and “Add New” to navigate to the “Upload New Media” Page. If your maximum upload file size is equivalent to “2MB” as shown above, then you will have issue uploading any file size that is greater than 2MB.



3. Go to CheapCloud main page. Simply click the “Login” button from the main page.

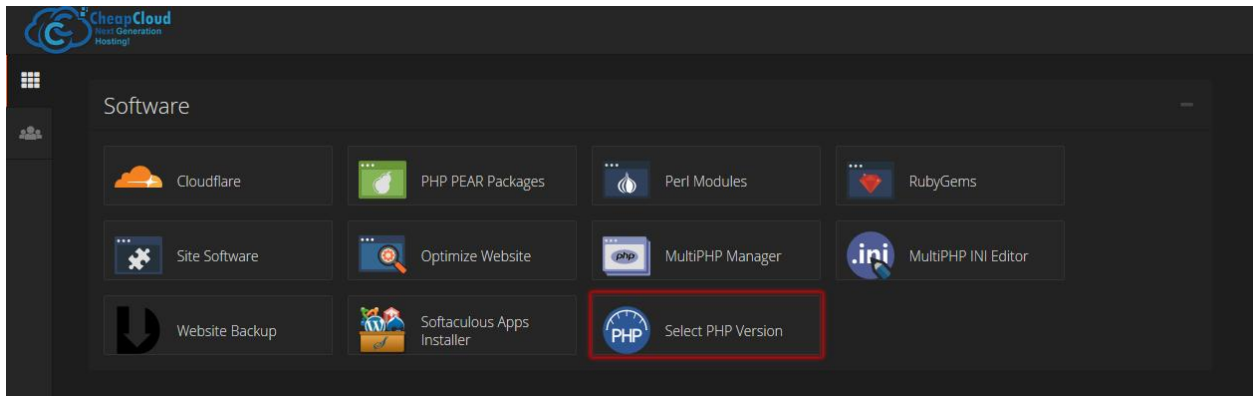

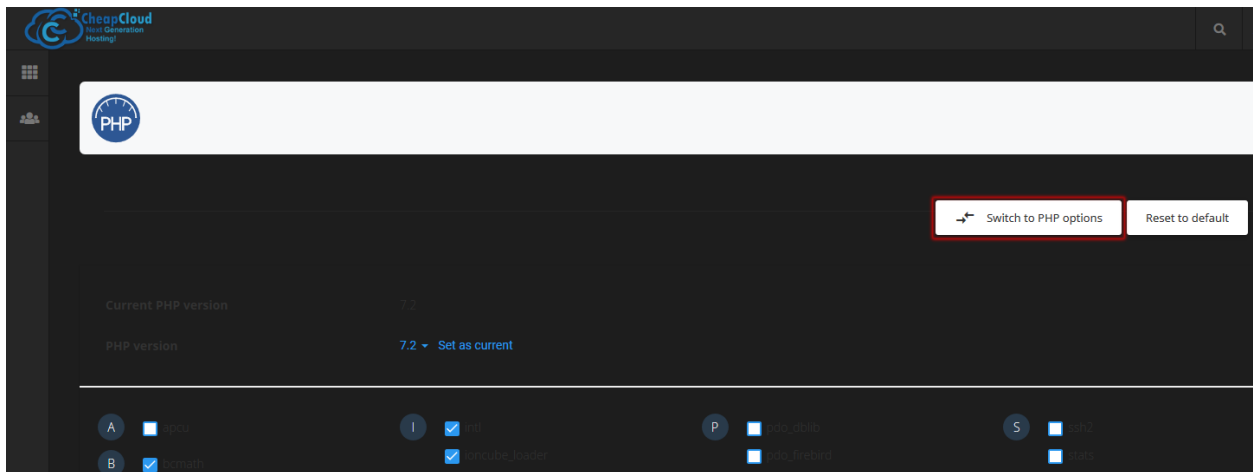

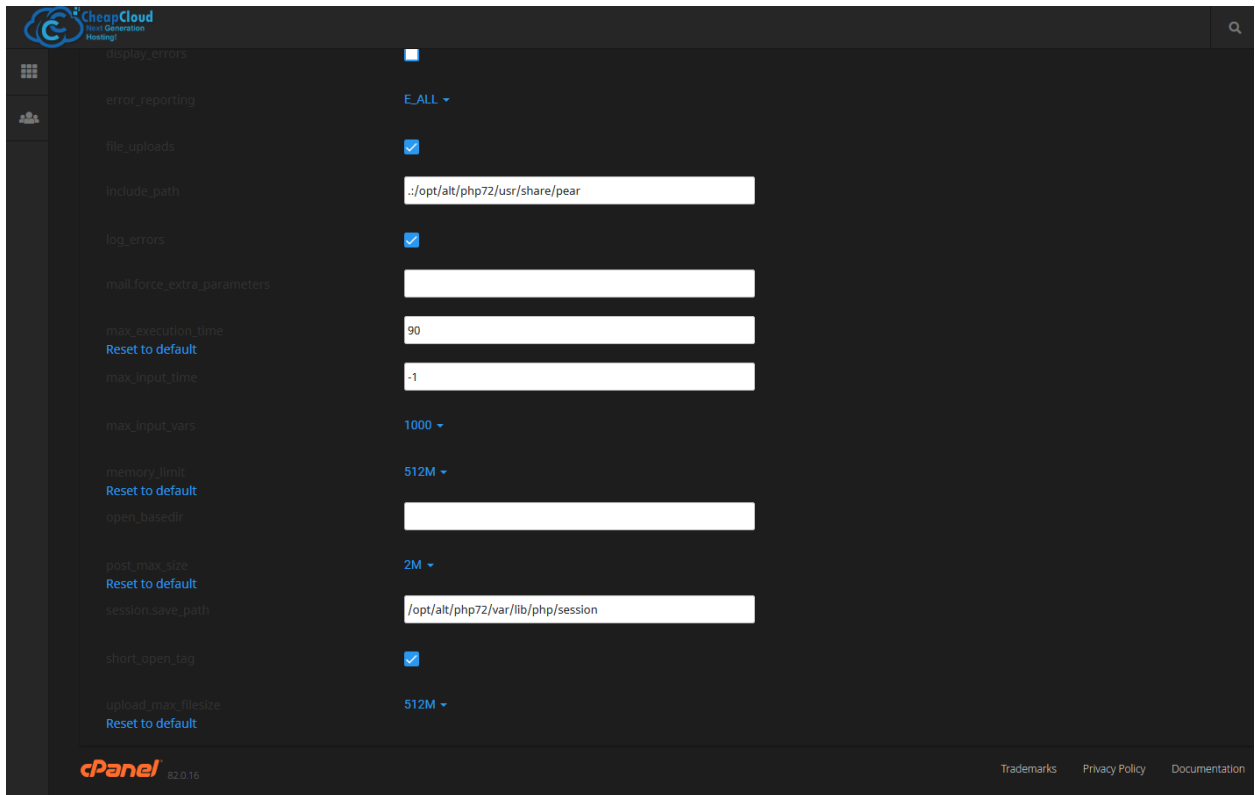
7. Select “Login to cPanel”. This will launch the cPanel feature.



8. Scroll down until you reach “**Software**” section. Select “**Select PHP Version**” to launch the application.



9. Select **“Switch to PHP Options”**.

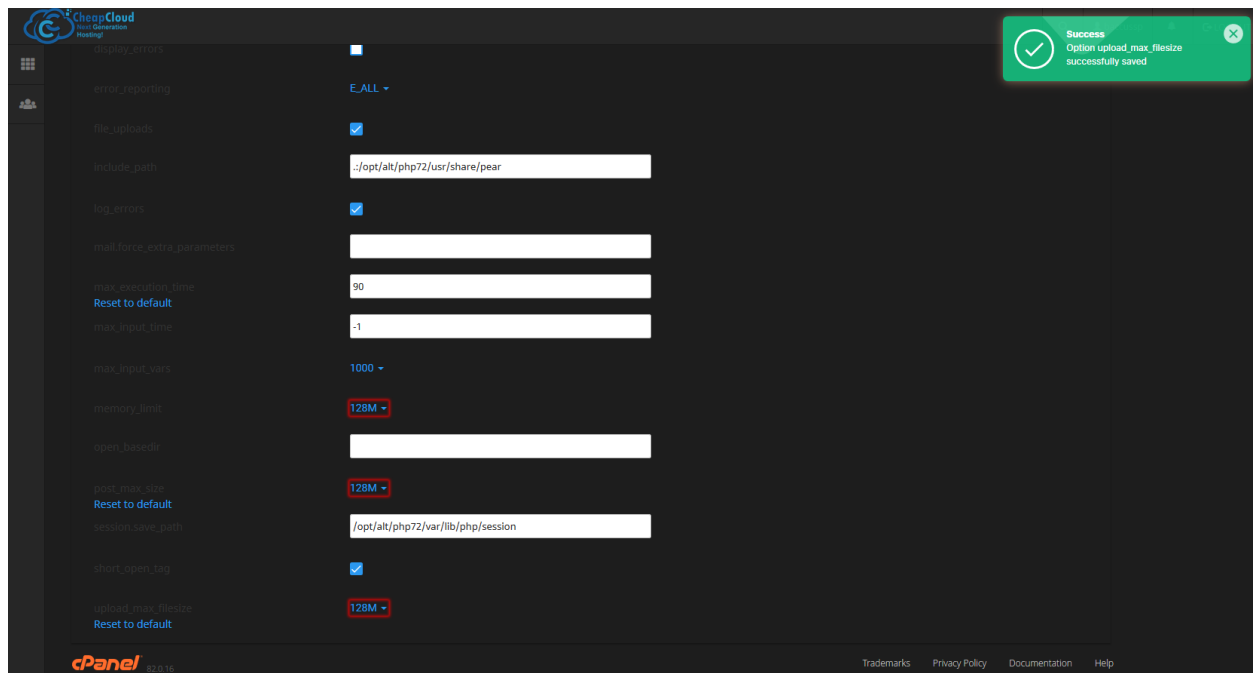

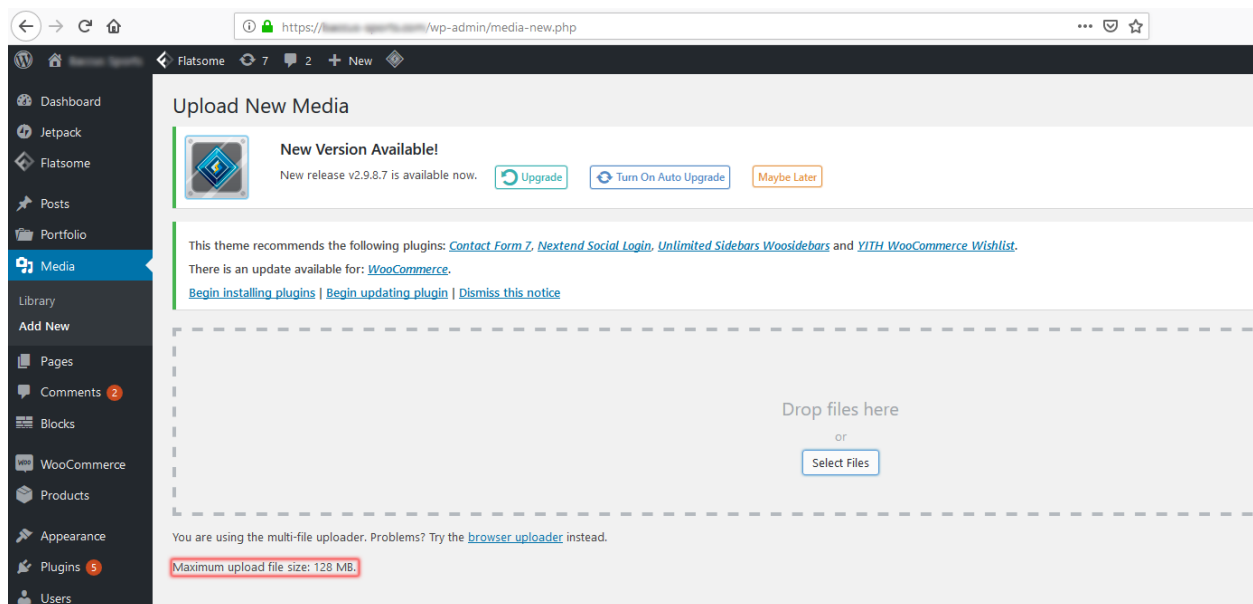

10. Scroll down to the bottom of this page.



11. Make sure “**memory limit**”, “**post_max_size**” and “**upload_max_filesize**” setting are being changed based on the above setting. In this scenario, we are using size 128M as an example and you may change to other size according to your needs.



12. Go back to your WordPress website administration page, make sure the maximum upload file size is changed based on the setting configured at cPanel PHP Version.
